Governing students earning the Associate In Applied Science (AAS) in Nursing degree from Dabney S. Lancaster Community College who will pursue the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree at Jefferson College of Health Sciences.

PREAMBLE


The Jefferson College of Health Sciences (JCHS) and Dabney S. Lancaster Community College (DSLCC), in their efforts to serve the educational needs of their students, and to work collegially to improve access to higher education for the benefit of their service areas, do hereby establish this Articulation Agreement.

This Articulation Agreement pertains to those students earning the AAS in Nursing degree from DSLCC who seek to complete the BSN degree from JCHS.


ARTICLES

1. DSLCC graduates will be admitted as candidates for articulation if they complete the AAS in Nursing degree.
2. The Articulation Agreement students must meet the same standards as all other JCHS students for official admission into the BSN program. The admission requirements are listed in the JCHS catalog for the year in which a student applies to JCHS. Refer to the JCHS catalog for details.
3. All DSLCC graduates will enter JCHS with Junior status. They will receive transfer credit for 6 credit hours of English. As described in the RN to BSN section of the JCHS College Catalog, validation of 54 credit hours will occur as the student progresses through the BSN program. This will result in 60 credit hours that will be applied towards the BSN. Credit allocation is described in the BSN Curriculum for DSLCC Articulation Agreement (attached).
4. All college level courses taken at DSLCC outside of the Nursing curriculum may be transferred as general education electives. General education courses may also be taken at JCHS. PHL 301 Critical Thinking and ENG 325 Communication in Professional Practice must be taken at JCHS.

5. Hours remaining for completion of the BSN degree will vary according to the general education courses taken at DSLCC.
6. This agreement shall commence January 10, 2011 and run continuously without necessity of renewal. In the event of a change in curriculum, the school initiating the change will communicate the change to the articulating school with the intent of revising the agreement if necessary to ensure continuation of the articulation agreement.
7. Either party, upon one semester's (Fall or Spring) written notice, may terminate this agreement. In event of termination, students who have matriculated at JCHS will be continued through completion of the BSN degree.
