Accurate, Engaging History: The Truth is More Interesting!

This course will begin by taking an honest look at what, how, and if we are currently teaching history content in public schools. Hit hard by the effects of continuing high-stakes testing issues and the resulting school accreditation impact, the social studies content area has taken some hard hits in the past decade or more. Textbooks (the companies who publish them) continue to produce biased and, in some cases, inaccurate accounts of actual events. This course will offer the *real* truth about Columbus, American Indians, Thanksgiving, immigrants, women, and many other misrepresented or neglected issues and cultures. Incorporating STEM/STEAM in Your Classroom

Bookmaking: Displaying and Publishing Children's Writing

Nothing motivates students to write more than to publish their own work in a form that makes them feel like real authors. This class will offer ideas and methods for you to guide students in transforming their stories, poems, and non-fiction writing into published books. Create a product that kids can take home and read to parents, display in your classroom, share with peers or students in other classrooms, and generally show off their work. Motivate kids to *want* to write by creating your own classroom library of works solely by student authors. Examples of projects/techniques include shape books, sewn bindings, duct tape binding, accordion books, wall paper covers, poetry blocks, and pop-up books.
